Question: Interpretation:

Std: NZS 4512:2003 Fire detection and alarm systems in buildings, 405.2.2(b)

Interpretation: Issued by the Alarms and Detection Group

- 1. Is there a depth (e.g. o.8 m, similar to that for ceiling voids) where the installation of underfloor detectors becomes mandatory?
- 1. No
- 2. Is detection required if the space is empty of equipment or stores and the only access is via a locked hatch on the outside of the building, used for installing or maintaining services (plumbing, electrical, and so on)?
- 2. No. For the purposes of this clause, "access" to concealed space under-floor areas applies to general building users, not specialist tradespersons. A small secure manhole or trapdoor (internal or external) is acceptable for a concealed space without constituting "access", unless there is evidence the space is regularly occupied or used for storage.
